From 2022: NPU-F approved the application for a new business at this location at its July 2021 meeting. The current application is for a change of agent for an existing retail package store to sell beer and wine. Operating hours are Mon-Sun 10AM-3AM. The GB License LLC was denied an alcohol license by Cobb Co for failure to meet distance requirements. GB License LLC appealed the denial and sought a waiver to the distance requirement which was granted by the Cobb County Board of Commissioners and an alcohol license issued. Neither the agent nor the location in COA has had an alcohol license denied, suspended or revoked within the past 24 months.

<u>Club Platinum</u> Sineet Tesfay	1905 Piedmont Road	Nightclub Adult Entertainment Change of Ownership
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Comments: MLPA voted unanimously not to support. Attorney Hakim Hilliard represented the applicant. Ms Tesfay attended online. The application was denied by the NPU in 2021 and 2022. The property is zoned MRC2C. With a maximum capacity of 150, it does not meet parking requirements. The application does not meet distance requirements. There is currently no business license at the location. This application is not a change of ownership, rather it is a change of license. The applicant has misrepresented facts on prior applications. There are numerous complaints from neighbors and the business has sold alcohol without a valid license. The license expired on 12/31/21. Ms Rawlings stated the underlying reasons that support denial of the application. A temporary license is currently being used to operate. Following are some of the issues raised by NPU-F residents and responses -

It appears that the lease is held by operator under dispute. It is an active lease with different agents on the property. There are noise and parking issues. Guns are stashed illegally. It is a legal but nonconforming use.

LRB will decide on license.

A business owner adjacent to the Club stated a number of concerns, chief being that he cannot contact the owner.

The final day that the previous business operated at the location was July 4, 2022.

Armed security carrying assault rifles is detrimental to the neighborhood.

Plans for managing shortage of parking spaces are not clear.

Legal issues need to be resolved before matter is voted on but the applicant has the right to submit an application.

All of the issues need to be worked out before NPU support can be granted.

NPU-F Action: Motion to deny made by Jane Rawlings 2nd by Kay Stephenson carries by a vote of 64 in favor of denial, 3 opposed to the motion. A subsequent hand count showed 74 in favor of the denial motion, 2 opposed

Ansley Park report: Rose and Mary Nell attended the Ansley Park Zoning Committee meeting at which the new agent, William (Richard) Ramey attended.

Richard mentioned he was going to have speakers for music on The Eagle patio. He also mentioned the business continues to have minority ownership with Marco Penna, the previous agent. A sound study was conducted on the so-called sound improvements made by HV entertainment last year. No reduction in sound volume was detected, as conducted by Merck. Richard stated he has made additional improvements. However, we are still woken up by noise from the venues. At the NPU E meeting, Rose Holston proposed the change of agent be **approved with the stipulation that no speakers are allowed on the patio.** It is my understanding, NPU-E agreed with that recommendation.

PHCA Report: Recommend support of the change of agent noting no complaints since the changeover in October to Atlanta Eagle. The applicant had also met with the neighboring Ansley Park association who did not oppose this application. Vote was unanimous 8-0. Comments: Agent present. Change of agent for existing restaurant. Lisa Morchower is attorney.

NPU-F Action: Motion to approve made by Jane Rawlings 2nd by Kay Stephenson carries by a vote of 33 in favor, 9 opposed. The motion was conditioned on no amplified speakers on the patio, subject to the City of Atlanta noise ordinance.

Ms Morchower stated that speakers should be allowed at Atlanta Eagle consistent with the noise ordinance.

The mayor spoke about his Year of the Youth initiative which he said will include young people programs from "diapers to degrees". There were focus groups to get input on affordable housing, economic development and vitality, infrastructure planning, place-based public safety, youth development and education and youth development grant orientation. I participated in a discussion on the development of an Atlanta Thriving Neighborhood Index. I spoke to several of my NPU counterparts as I left and folks felt it was a good session, but were not optimistic that there would be much follow-through. NPU-F will continue to meet virtually on the third Wednesday of the month.
