Atlanta Police Department Zone 2 – Major Ailen Mitchell Zone 6 – Major Webster	Zone 2 Ben Vayens - In 2023 We were down 3%. That's our third year in a row down in crime, which is pretty excellent. We're very happy about that. But as we move into 2024, we want to take those successes and build on them. I'll go line by line. For homicides we were down 27%. For rapes we were down 70%. For aggregated assaults we were down 24% Robberies we were down
	30% Burglaries, we were down 17%.
	Theft from auto vehicles, we were down 2%. Shoplifting as a gives major mission like quite a bit of heartburn.



	We were up 33%. Other larcenies, which include package thefts. Bicycle thefts, snatching of cell phones.
	Problems of that nature, we were down 22% and motor vehicle thefts we were up 7%.
	The only 2 crimes up in 2023 were shoplifting and motor vehicle thefts.
	Motor vehicle thefts really turned it up for us in the last quarter of the year from September to December 30 first.
	For zone 2 we didn't see a lot of the Kia and Hyundai thefts that spread throughout the nation and Atlanta. Until the last quarter of the year and that's where we saw the big increase cause us to be up 7% in auto thefts inn 2023 but I will say going in 2024 through the first 17 days.
	We're down 23% in crime right now. And the officers are still engaged, they're working hard.
	After the holidays and through the new year. So, specifically for NPU-F. Biggest issues outside of obviously some of the transportation issues we've got along Cheshire Bridge.
	Right at Lindbergh and Cheshire Bridge. And then furthe down at Faulkner and Cheshire Bridge with the bridge being closed right now.
	So roughly 33% of our crime were set for motor vehicles. So leaving bags, computers, electronics, firearms in you vehicles that's what those offenders and criminals are looking for. So we push a Clean Car campaign.
	Taking those items out of your vehicles or securing your firearms. I know the other night we did have a shooting at Allure. And that appears to be a targeted incident that we're still working on. With our aggregated assault unit as well as licensing permits.
	They've actually got a couple open cases already and litigation. And pending suspension that they still haven't served from 2022.
	Zone 6 – Lt Carroll – The usual stuff. Make sure you keep your cars empty and do not leave key fobs in your car.

5. Comments from Elected Officials

Alex Wan – We do not have to tear down the bridge on Cheshire Bridge. It can be repaired. The original timeline was about 10 weeks. The challenge right now was we're still waiting on an okay from CSX and I'll be honest with you, the weather is not helping either. So we're gonna have to pray for warm dry weather.
Once we get the green light from CSX, we'll get flying on that. The good news is we and learned our lessons from everything that we did wrong with the other bridge and the 15 months or 18 months I can't remember how long that was.
The other thing that I'm working on is what I did also share with the mayor is that, you know, if we clear out these encampments, it doesn't solve the problem.
It just moves it to somewhere else in the district. So I'm working with administration. We're trying to do a pilot project with in-town CARES, which is the former Intel ministries, to do kind of focused and dedicated social workers.
I think we're doing 4 or 5 sites with across the city and I've asked that our district be included in that.
My thought is, you know, the Virginia Highland Corridor where we've already seen an uptick in and housing insecure folks.
So I, I'm again just trying to think ahead and make sure that We're not just moving the problem around or postponing it that we're actually trying to address it.
The reason Intown Cares is successful is they go in multiple times and a continued intervention and conversations with the individuals to convince them to go get support services.
Todd Corley asked about traffic conditions on Cheshire Bridge. Nothing has been done despite ATL 311 submissions.
Alex Wan responded that he has outstanding meetings with our state rep, Stacey Evans. You know, one of the things that we're trying to do is figure out if there's a way to improve the intersection at Cheshire and Lavista. It's an intersection of a state road and a city road. So we kind of have to work together on it. The city doesn't really have the resources to do any sort of real estate purchase to be able to expand that intersection, but I think that that was one of the things that we're going to continue looking at.

Legislation

#### <u>Z-23-87</u>

An Ordinance by Councilmember Marci Collier Overstreet to amend the 1982 Atlanta Zoning Ordinance, as amended, to require a special use permit for the development of one or more detached single-family dwelling, as a permitted principal use and structure, with fewer than 750 square feet; and for other purposes. <u>FACT SHEET.</u>

The intent is to provide protection for single-family neighborhoods in the mentioned zoning districts to permit new development while being compatible with neighborhood character.

*Per Section I.* Special use permit (SUP) requirements for the development of one or more detached singlefamily dwellings, as a permitted principal use and structure, with fewer than 750 square feet. Unless otherwise expressly noted in the district regulations, issuance of a special use permit, the manner prescribed herein, is required for the development of one or more detached single-family dwellings as a permitted <u>principal</u> use and structure, with fewer than 750 square feet.

Please note the highlighted language. The proposed Ordinance speaks to permitted principal uses (main structure) on the lot. The proposed Ordinance is not applicable to ADUs (accessory dwelling units), as an ADU is not a permitted principal use it is an accessory use and is found in the permitted accessory uses and structures section of the single family districts and permitted PA (permitted accessory in the SPI Districts).

This legislation will not affect the construction of ADUs in any district where they are permitted.

Example: *How this would work if adopted*. Should an applicant desire to construct a single family detached structure fewer than 750 sq. ft. on a lot that is zoned R-4. The minimum lot size is 9000 sq. ft. The proposed principal (main) structure is 750 sq. ft. An application for a special use permit would be submitted to the Office of Zoning and Development. The application would be routed to the NPU. The application would be heard in a public hearing before ZRB, and the legislation would be approved or denied by City Council.

The application would be evaluated based upon the compatibility of the character of design of the proposed structure consistent with adjacent properties and the neighborhood.
