Atlanta Fire Department Station 19 North Highland, Station 29 Monroe Drive Battalion Chief Christopher Martin mroman@atlantaga.gov 404.307.0941	The new, state of the art training center is expected to be operational by March; possibly sooner. Atlanta Fire just received six new vehicles which included three fire engines and three hybrid trucks. We also purchased battery-powered vehicle extrication equipment and are currently training all personnel in its use. This enables the equipment to be carried to the scene without needing to be attached to a power unit. Fire Station 22, NE Atlanta, is set to open December 20, 2024. The City is replacing Fire Stations 30 and 26. Station 30 is being demolished now; Station 26 will be done shortly after that. They have finished the testing season and will soon begin the final phase of promotions at the beginning of next year. We are entering the cold season. Keep in mind to check the batteries on your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. Please be careful with space heaters. 2024 Community Impact Project Status Reports	Community Impact Grant close-out report is due 12/31/24. We can be given some grace on our submission because we received the late check. The project managers have been sent instructions on how to prepare their close-out report.
	The 2025 Community Impact Grants were released last week. The basic program has not changed from last year. There are a couple of soft spots to be aware of. One is that there is money for upgrades and in plant installations. It's not actually coming from this grants project; it is coming from the Parks Dept. The project manager at the City has indicated that they received a soft commitment to fund these projects.
	The max award for each NPU is around \$10,000 which includes a \$1,500 training bonus for NPU officers. I will be forwarding the training programs and dates to the newly elected officers.
	If you are interested in applying for a grant, please send me an email to get the specifics on what is required. Grant submissions must be submitted in early March, which means the NPU will need to vote on grant projects at our February meeting.
