2025 Community Impact Project	 We finally cleared the 2024 CIG Closeout – thanks to those who worked with me to get the documents requested after the deadline. One project not funded for 2025 was the NPU website and Google Workspace platform that we use for managing emails. Councilmember Alex Wan has generously said that he will fund both for 5 years. The funds will be sent to the VaHi District Association (our 2025 fiscal agent) and I will be reimbursed for the payments I have made monthly. Thank you Alex!! We received the 2025 Community Impact Grant award letter last week and 4 projects were funded as follows: Friends of Orme Park - \$1,496 VH Safety Patrol Banners - \$2,000 VH District Assoc Planters - \$1,000 Armand Park Native Plannings - \$1,920 I have appealed the grant award because we did not receive the \$1,500 training bonus for attending 3 NPU-U courses. Several of the NPU officers attended classes this year and we should have met the requirement.

	Fingers crossed. If we receive it, it will go to the projects that did not
	receive their max request for funds 2025 Community Impact Grant funds should be available by May 23rd
	- Please be sure to check the Consent Agenda for the Public Engagement
Chair Report	opportunities:
	- Amsterdam Walk: Not much to add. It's fairly well known that despite the
	amazing efforts of MLP and VH neighbors and others throughout the city,
	including the extensive media coverage, City Council approved the Portman
	application. I am particularly unhappy that not a single Councilmember who
	voted for the project had the courtesy of explaining their vote. That is an insult
	to the public and their commitment to citizen engagement. A reminder that the
	mayor (whose office was reportedly complicit in the vote outcome) and all
	members of Council are up for reelection in November. Your vote is your voice.
	 If you attend any of their campaign events, please be sure to ask them why. 816 Adair Circle variance: At the April meeting, a concern was raised at the end
	of the meeting of two people who voted to oppose the variance, who might not
	have been eligible because of their status as trustees in a Trust for the adjacent
	property. In the interest of privacy, I'm not going to mention names. I was asked
	to research the issue. Since the definition of membership in an NPU is defined in
	City ordinances, I have discussed the issue with the Director of the NPU Support
	team and asked that the City Law Department provide some guidance. That was
	nearly a month ago, and still no response. I also learned that the two who voted
	were 100% trustees for two individual trusts for the property. Finally, we've
	looked at the bylaws and our Policy Sheet and will be making some recommendations to include Trustees in the voting requirements if appropriate.
	Our protocol for processing proof of eligibility is also being reviewed. Based on
	our records, it does not appear that neither individual took the 2 nd step of
	providing proof. As a reminder – to register as an eligible voter, it's a two-step
	process: 1st you fill in a template form and then you are sent a link to send proof
	of your residency or business association.
	- Charles Kaften spoke regarding getting Monroe Drive design by the City Council.
	Alex Wan stated it had been in the works for ten years. It's time to get this done.
	- Tim Langen commented about how Piedmont Park has become the defacto site
	for class A and class B events compare to other parts of the city. Is this something that has been brought up with the city? The fall events especially are
	tough on the lawn. Doug Widener, President and CEO of Piedmont Park
	Conservancy, said that they only handle five of these events. All other festivals
	go through the city. Centennial Park is opening an indoor event venue but it's
	not big enough for festivals. Lots of discussion regarding having fewer events
	there.
	- As mentioned last month, we received an SAP for a business at 2087 Piedmont
	Road for a restaurant; the applicant is Nana Addaquay for Sahara Atlanta. This is
	the former Looks of Atlanta location. It was sent to MLPA, Lindridge Martin
	Manor and Piedmont Heights for review. The SAP Hearing has not been set (not on June agenda).
	- Moving forward on (finally) getting the Piedmont Heights Master Plan
	incorporated into the 2025 CDP (Plan A). It should be on our agenda for a vote
	in the next couple months.
	- Had a good meeting hosted by CM Alex Wan regarding the Tacos and Taquila
	Fest held in Piedmont Park a couple weekends ago. Many of you probably
	heard the music. Also in attendance was Doug Widener, President PPC,
	Commissioner Justin Cutler from Parks and Rec, residents from the Belvedere
	condos on Dutch Valley and representatives from MLPA and VH. PPC is
	committed to working with neighbors to find a solution to the noise and other
	issues. They listened and took notes from neighbor suggestions. CM Wan said

- that this group would continue to meet.
- Speaking of special events I need help with working with the Midtown Neighbors Association on two big events in PP later this year (Shakey Knees and One Music Fest). If you live near PP and have a stake in the outcome of the events, please send me an email. There will be some meetings coming up in the next couple months with the producers for both. There's a lot of stuff that we can't fix the way we like, but we are able to make it better by working with the event organizers so that these events are tolerable and enjoyable by neighbors.
