Regarding scope, the ordinance states: "...require buildings of any use type with the exception of single family and two-family structures with primary street fronting pedestrian entrances to have a push button activator".

There was a question if existing establishments are Grandfathered? Doug Young stated typically these types of ordinances only apply to future construction/permits unless specifically stated in the ordinance. It is currently unknown by NPU-F if this ordinance has such a statement. SECTION 21: simply states "This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon approval."

It was expressed that this ordinance has merit and is a reasonable requirement in the interest of making businesses accessible to everyone.
